Unity Park Bike Path, First Street, Turners Falls, 11am

Funded with an Expand Massachusetts Stories Grant from Mass Humanities, The Peskeompskut Audio Tour explores the nuanced local history of Peskeompskut, an important Native American settlement sieged in 1676 during King Phillips War. The goal of this project is to ignite interest in Indigenous, Colonial and Industrial Era history and to honor the continuance the Nipmuc, Wampanoag and Abenaki people. Story topics range from ancient Indigenous history to the 19th Century Industrial Era. To connect to a story, simply scan one of the tour's QR codes located on posts along the bike path.
